





The Parties

The **Complainant** in this arbitration proceeding is *Dell Inc.*, is a Delaware corporation having its principal place of business One Dell Way, Round Rock, Texas 78682-2244, United States of America. The complainant is represented by the authorized representatives, Mr. Akhilesh Kumar Rai.

The **Respondent** in this arbitration proceeding is Mr. Deepak Rana, located at Apex Systems, B 13, 3rd Floor, Shankar Garden, Vikaspuri, Delhi 110018 as per the details given by the Who is database maintained by the National Internet Exchange of India [NIXI].

The Domain Name and Registrar

The disputed Domain name is *www.delllaptopservicecenterdelhi.in*. The Registrar with which the disputed domain name is registered is *Go Daddy*.

Procedural History [Arbitration Proceedings]

This arbitration proceeding is in accordance with the .IN Domain Name Dispute Resolution Policy [INDRP], adopted by the National Internet Exchange of India ["NIXI"]. The INDRP Rules of Procedure [the Rules] were approved by NIXI on 28th June 2005 in accordance with the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. By registering the disputed domain name with the NIXI accredited Registrar, the Respondent agreed to the resolution of the disputes pursuant to the IN Dispute Resolution Policy and Rules framed there under.


According to the information provided by the National Internet Exchange of India ["NIXI"], the history of this proceeding is as follows:

In accordance with the Rules, 2(a) and 4(a), NIXI formally notified the Respondent of the Complaint, and appointed James Muktattukavunkal as the Sole Arbitrator for adjudicating upon the dispute in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, and the Rules framed there under, .IN Domain Name Dispute Resolution Policy and the Rules framed there under. The Arbitrator submitted the Statement of Acceptance and Declaration of Impartiality and Independence, as required by NIXI.

The Information as to the handover of the case to the panel was notified to all concerned parties on 10th February, 2020. However, at the request for documents, the respondent has directly contacted the arbitrator and has expressed the intention to surrender the domain name to the Complainant vide e-mail dated 19th February, 2020 and 1st March 2020.

Discussions and Findings

In line with previous decisions e.g., *Williams-Sonoma, Inc. v EZ-Port*, WIPO Case No. D2000-0207, *Amgen Inc. v. Texas International Property Associates*, WIPO Case No. D2007-0155, *Valero Energy Corporation, Valero Refining and Marketing Company v. Rare Names, Web Reg*, WIPO Case No. D2007-0857, *Instituto del Fondo Nacional de la Vivienda para los Trabajadores v. Whois Privacy Protection Service Inc, Demand Domains, Inc.* WIPO Case No. D2007-0917, since the Respondent has consented to the transfer of the disputed domain name to the Complainant, the panel finds that in this case there is no need to assess the facts supporting the claim.



The Respondent in this proceeding has expressly agreed to transfer – without admitting to the elements of paragraph 4(a) of the policy – the disputed domain name to the Complainant upon order of the Panel. Therefore, as held in *Amgen Inc. v. Texas International Property Associates, supra*, “given Respondent’s consent to transfer, this Panel deems it appropriate to grant the request of transfer. No further consideration or discussion of the elements of the Policy is deemed necessary”.

Decisions

For all the foregoing reasons, in accordance with Paragraphs 4(i) of the Policy and 15 of the Rules, the Panel orders that the domain name, <de11laptopservicecenterdelhi.in> be transferred to the Complainant.

The National Internet Exchange of India [NIXI] is directed to monitor the transfer of the domain name to the Complainant.
